THE EPISTLE 1 Timothy 6.6-19

A READING from the First Letter of Paul to Timothy

There is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains. But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will bring about at the right time -- he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen. As for

those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

The Holy Gospel Luke 16.19-31

THE HOLY GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO SAINT LUKE

R. Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Jesus said, "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames.' But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us.' He said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house-- for I have five brothers-- that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' He said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.'"

THE SERMON Dr. Taylor

THE NICENE CREED (people stand)


THE HOLY COMMUNION

In the Episcopal Church, our normative manner of worship is the Celebration of the Holy Eucharist presided over by a priest or bishop. When a priest is not available, the bishop may, at their discretion, authorize a deacon to distribute Holy Communion to the congregation from the reserved Sacrament.

Since a priest is not available today, the Eucharistic Elements which you will receive today have been consecrated at a Mass (Holy Eucharist) celebrated by a priest at some earlier time (giving the name to the service: Liturgy of the Presanctified). As such, the second part of the service today differs from the normal Sunday liturgy of the Holy Eucharist (The Mass). There is no consecration of the Eucharist Elements, so the Eucharistic Prayer, or Canon of the Mass, and the Fraction, or Breaking of the Bread are omitted. The Deacon will bring the pre-consecrated elements from the Tabernacle and place them on the Altar during the Offertory Hymn. After the hymn is sung, the Lord's Prayer is offered.

Parish Life and Beyond

ALBANY BLOOMS — We continue this week with our second Albany Blooms class on spirituality, this week a practicum on Centering Prayer which was introduced this past week. The class will meet this Wednesday, October 1st. At 6:00 p.m. in Cranmer House. The following week Jonathan Kimmel of the Cathedral of All Saints returns to talk about *lectio divina*.

FOYER DINNERS — Foyer Groups are small groups of parishioners who gather for dinner on a regular basis, usually in each other's homes. Each year we reorganize the groups so that everyone has opportunity to better come to know a wide cross section of parishioners. CHURCH SCHOOL — We had a nice start to our first Church School class of the season. Church School is for 1st—6th grade students with older students invited to assist. Our next Church School class will be October 12th.

Confirmation Class — The Right Reverend Jeremiah Williamson, Tenth Bishop of Albany, will make his triennial visitation to St. George's Church on Sunday, December 14th, the Third Sunday of Advent. During his visit Bishop Williamson will be the celebrant of the Holy Eucharist and preacher. He will also administer the Sacrament of Confirmation, and receive into the Episcopal Church any one who has been confirmed in another church with Apostolic Succession (Roman Catholic, Orthodox, etc.). If you are 12 years of age or older, and have not been confirmed, or have been confirmed in another denomination, you should be confirmed when Bishop Williamson comes. Anyone who wishes to be confirmed (Adult or youth) will need to attend Confirmation Classes which will be held on Sundays, following Mass during coffee hour. The Dates of the Confirmation Classes will be: October 19 & 26, November 2, 16, & 23, and December 7. If you are unsure if you need to be Confirmed or received, please speak to a member of the clergy.

Looking Ahead

COMPLINE — Compline will be chanted by the St. Cecilia Choir on Tuesday, October 21st, at 7:30 p.m. Compline is the last office of prayer during the day. The choir will chant it in a similar fashion as monks, nuns and others have done for centuries. It is a lovely ending to the day as we offer our last word to God.
