TODAY WE WELCOME Bishop Jeremiah Williamson, the Tenth Bishop of Albany, for his triennial parochial visitation to St. George's Church. Bishops in the Episcopal Church are required by canon law to visit each parish in diocese every three years. The visit of a bishop is a special event in the life of any parish. The bishops of the Church are the direct successors of the Apostles who were ordained, consecrated, and sent out by our Lord to preach the Gospel to the ends of the Earth. The Bishop is the chief priest and pastor in the Diocese, uniting the many parishes with one another and the wider Church. Today, the Bishop will celebrate the Holy Eucharist, Preach the Word of God, and Administer the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, as well as formally receive members from other denominations into the Episcopal Church.

Today's liturgy is a special form of the Mass in recognition of the presence of the Bishop. It begins with the Bishop knocking on the door of the church, formally requesting entrance to his parish. When he enters, he pauses for prayer, blesses the congregation with Holy Water, a reminder of our Baptism. He processes to the Altar, where he is ceremonially clothed in the vestments for Mass. The Bishop wears both the chasuble worn by priests at mass, and the dalmatic, worn by deacons, to signify the fullness of the ministry of the Church which the Bishop possesses. After vesting, the Bishop and altar party will offer the preparatory prayers, usually said by the ministers and choir in the Lady Chapel. The Bishop sits in a special chair, on the north, or Gospel Side, of the church. The chair is draped with a canopy, to signify it's special purpose during the liturgy as being for the Bishop.

Much of the Mass will be familiar to regular parishioners. But some parts, like the Blessing at the end of Mass, are a unique form, used only by bishops. It is customary to kneel to receive the blessing from the bishop at the end of Mass.

THE FLOWERS AT THE HIGH ALTAR are given to the Greater Glory of Almighty God by the Clergy, Churchwardens, and Vestry of Saint George's Church to mark Gaudete Sunday and the visit of our Diocesan Bishop, The Right Reverand Jerimiah D. Williamson, Tenth Bishop of Albany.

THE SOLEMN RECEPTION OF THE BISHOP OF ALBANY

Please stand when the Rector's Procession proceeds from the Sacristy to the West Doors of the Church.

The Bishop knocks on the West Doors of the Church with the Pastoral Staff. The doors are opened from within. The Bishop enters the church and kisses a crucifix presented to him by the Rector. The Bishop kneels for a moment of quiet prayer. He is then presented Holy Water and sprinkles himself, the Altar Party and the Congregation. As the procession moves to the Altar, the Choir sings the anthem "Ecce Sacerdos" to welcome the Bishop to his Parish Church.

As the Procession proceeds to the Altar, choir sings:

THE VESTING OF THE BISHOP FOR MASS

He exchanges the cope, a processional vestment, for the vestments proper to the Eucharist, a pontifical dalmatic and chasuble.

Deacon Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. *Amen*.

THE BAPTISM

As water is poured over the head of the candidate three times, the priest says Quincy, I Baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**.

Then the Bishop then places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross using Chrism and saying:

Quincy, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen**.

The Bishop: Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised *him* to the new life of grace. Sustain *him*, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. N., we recognize you as a member of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you. *Amen.*

Almighty and everliving God, let your fatherly hand ever be over *these* your *servants*; let your Holy Spirit ever be with *them*; and so lead *them* in the knowledge and obedience of your Word, that *they* may serve you in this life, and dwell with you in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**




